

## West Hallam Village Show Rules 2024

All Exhibitors must abide by the Show Rules printed below

Entry forms for all classes (with entry fees) must be returned by **Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> August 2024 to 9 The Village, West Hallam, Ilkeston DE7 6GR**

Entry fee for all classes: 50p per exhibit

All exhibits must be submitted and staged between 5 & 7pm on Friday, 30<sup>th</sup> August with the exception of all bakery classes which should be submitted between 8 & 9am on Show Day and junior class 33

All entries must be the work of the exhibitor

Junior classes: some parental guidance is accepted but judging will be based on the child's work: the child's age must appear on the entry form Children and young people may also enter class 26 – photography – and bakery classes 13 - 18

All art, craft and photography exhibits must have been completed within the last 3 years

No responsibility will be accepted for loss or damage to exhibitor's property

The judges' decisions are final

There is no limit to the number of entries an exhibitor can submit in any class but no exhibitor shall receive more than one prize in any one class

Prizes will be awarded as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> prize £1, 2<sup>nd</sup> prize 75p, 3<sup>rd</sup> prize 50p

All exhibits must remain in the Show until 4:30 on Show Day

All exhibits **must** be collected from the Hall on Show Day not before **4.30pm and not after 5.30pm**

## West Hallam Village Show Schedule 2024

### Fruit and Vegetables

**Best in Show (Fruit and Veg): £5 prize sponsored by Paul & Mary Butler**

- Class 1: 3 carrots, parsnips or beetroot of one variety: tops trimmed to about 6"  
Class 2: 4 potatoes of one variety - washed  
Class 3: 5 tomatoes of one variety – with calyx  
Class 4: 7 cherry tomatoes with calyx  
Class 5: 4 runner beans  
Class 6: 3 apples of one variety  
Class 7: any other vegetable – **judged to equal points** – including rhubarb.  
2 samples or 1 cabbage etc  
Class 8: any other fruit, not in schedule, of one variety – **excluding** rhubarb -  
an appropriate number  
Class 9: the wonkiest vegetable. Produce must be fresh & in good condition

*N.B. fruit & vegetables must be displayed on paper plates – not provided*

### Flowers

- Class 10: 3 blooms of one variety, displayed in a vase (*not provided*)  
Class 11: mixed vase of flowers (*no additional foliage*)  
Class 12: potted house plant, flowering or foliage, **judged to equal points**

### Bakery & Preserves

**Best in Show (Bakery & Preserves): £5 prize sponsored by West Hallam & District WI**

- Class 13: Victoria sandwich; 8" tin, 3 eggs, raspberry jam filling, caster sugar top  
Class 14: Lemon Drizzle cake made from the set recipe with the entry form  
Class 15: Bakewell tart – no set size  
Class 16: 3 cheese scones  
Class 17: 1lb loaf of bread (made in a bread-maker or by traditional method)  
Class 18: 3 pieces of chocolate brownie – **Gluten free**

*N.B. all bakery goods must be displayed on a crockery plate – not provided*

- Class 19: 1lb jar of jam (any variety); *must have cellophane top*  
Class 20: 1lb jar of chutney; *with metal lid & label indicating mild/medium/hot*

Class 21: 1lb jar of marmalade; *must have cellophane top*

**N.B. Preserves must be in glass jars and labelled, including date made**

### Crafts

**Best in Show (Crafts): £5 prize sponsored by West Hallam Craft Group**

- Class 22: Knitting – a pair of gloves or mittens for a child or adult  
Class 23: An item of hand-worked embroidery  
Class 24: A toy – made using any material including hard toys, soft toys,  
stuffed or knitted  
Class 25: Any other item of handicraft excluding knitting or embroidery

### Photography

- Class 26: Village Life – images from within a village i.e. people, sights,  
buildings, places of interest. Pictures can be in colour or black and white.

### Art

- Class 27: "Something I love": a landscape, portrait of a person or animal or a  
still life of an object

### Junior Classes

**£5 prize for effort and achievement donated by Linda Webster**

- Class 28: **3 - 6 years and 7 - 10 years. Indicate age on entry form**  
Clay or playdough model, own choice of subject.  
*Recipe for making playdough (if required) on web site.*  
Class 29: **11-14 years.** Junk model made from recyclable materials  
*Own choice of subject – no larger than 30cmx30cmx30cm*  
Class 30: **under 6 years.** Lego model – own design.  
Class 31: **7 – 10 years.** Lego model – own design  
Class 32: **11 – 14 years.** Lego model – own design  
Class 33: **11 years and under** Crispie cake with decoration
